

- 2. Change to contributions to NCRSC. Page 9 of guidelines on the SCFNA website: Under Operational Guidelines Section D. DELETE: 3. After paying all expenses and encumbering funds for projected expenses, all funds that exceed the established "Prudent Reserve" will be sent to the NCRSC, in the form of a donation. CHANGE TO: 3. The financial guidelines regarding contributions of SCFNA are as follows: a. Monthly Contribution Handling, 1. Minimum monthly contribution: The SCFNA will make a minimum monthly contribution to NCRSC in the amount of \$50. 2. Maximum total contribution: After paying all monthly expenses, any SCFNA funds exceeding the prudent reserve will be contributed to the NCRSC, up to a maximum of \$500. The maximum contribution will be reevaluated every year in March (which is a half-year

evaluation). 3. Excess funds: The retained excess funds, along with the prudent reserve, will be available for use by the SCFNA when needed until the annual budget meeting. b. Yearly Contribution Handling. 1. Fiscal year allocation: in September the excess funds in the SCFNA bank account (above prudent reserve) will be evaluated to determine if a higher prudent reserve is needed. If required, the funds will be used to fulfill the higher prudent reserve first. 2. Contribution to NCRSC: After ensuring the prudent reserve is met or exceeded, any remaining excess funds will be contributed to the NCRSC. Intent: This contribution structure allows SCFNA to stabilize its feast or famine financial cycles while also delivering more regular and consistent contributions to NCRSC. Maker: Janet B. Second: Lisa C.

RD/AD: 2023-2024 Environmental Scan Survey for Delegates SCFNA Groups and Area can provide feedback directly to your RCMs on issues that you would like NAWS and Zonal Service Bodies to improve. Your RCM's are at the moment going to report issues with the Zonal Support (see next topic), concerns over how events are calendared and accessible to the general public and NA Fellowship,

ZONAL Support

The Regional Delegate (RD) and Alternate Delegate (AD) asked the 23 Areas of the Northern California Region (NCR) at the monthly RSC (Regional Service Committee) meeting: "Does your region support the eight existing zones of the US to also collaborate as a single national service body?"

There are currently 8 NA zones in the United States. Our zone is called the <u>Western States Zonal Forum</u> which comprises 13 NA Regions, of which we are one of them. Our support of a national "presence" is loosely based on a comment made by the US Attorney General stating that the world services organization of NAWS precludes the federal government from working directly NA, suggesting that a national service body is needed to be "recognized" for both the PR and H&I efforts of NA. For a background on NA Zones, and the issues around getting a regional consciousness on the subject see <u>DRAFT - Zonal Support by SCFNA Area</u>. Your RCM's invite everyone in this area to read

this report that we are writing and provide your feedback and thoughts. Several issues have already been raised and are included in the report we are compiling.

REGIONAL H&I SURVEY: H&I Basics Survey

1. The deadline for this survey is 31 March, 2024. There have been many changes in the world since H&I Basics (www.na.org/basics) was first published in 2010, and NAWS has heard of many adaptations and new approaches. You may have experience in all the areas below, or just one. We appreciate your willingness to help us. This survey is intended to help create new resources for H&I service.

Our current vision is to have three H&I Basics – one focused on corrections, drug courts, and sponsorship behind the walls; another focused on carrying the message into treatment facilities; and one more on H&I committees and their function. We are open to wherever the Fellowship input leads us but wanted to give you an idea of how much we see there is to do. We need and want your help to revise our H&I resources to illustrate the range of current H&I experience.

RSC GUIDELINES MOTION: As RCM's we voted yes to approve the motion presented to change RSC Guidelines to allow either the BOD President or the Vice-President to present their report at the RSC. The motion passed. However, it raises a question for SCFNA: We don't have enough time to report these to our area and get Area conscience. We would require 60 days but haven't been asking for it. The RSC Guidelines VI:D7:Changes to the NCRSC Guidelines or policies of the RSC will be automatically tabled for a minimum of 1 month. Straw Poll: Do you want RCM's to have "vote of the area confidence" or do you want all motions at RSC to be "tabled" for 60 days, rather than one month?

The Group Booklet has a fresh new look, and we've added the footnote approved at WSC 2023: "Virtual NA meetings that meet regularly can choose to be an NA group if they meet the criteria described in this booklet. The same footnote will be added to A Guide to Local Services in NA, and the paragraph on the first page of Virtual Meeting Basics has been updated.



MEETING LOCATOR CHANGES

The most important assistance NA service bodies can provide is helping addicts find meetings. As we have been reporting, we have plans to improve World Service's role in that effort: rather than try to replicate the meeting information maintained at area, regional, and zonal levels, we will help people find local websites and phone numbers. (We will continue to maintain information for in-person or hybrid meetings that have no local service body to list them, and for virtual meetings.) To list or update virtual meeting information, just fill out this online form.

As a first step in this transition, we sent emails to the delegates of all seated and unseated regions and zones. We are asking delegates to confirm their member service bodies (regions, areas, etc.) and current helpline and phoneline information. We need the geographic center (city) for every service body and phone listing because when members search for meeting information, the results are returned based on that geographic information. Any updates for website addresses and phoneline information can be sent to Lori@na.org or Donnell@na.org.

We will discuss this at the upcoming conference participant web meeting, and we may have a separate web meeting focused solely on this topic if it seems like that would be helpful.

PLANNING

We launched a new collaborative planning process at WSC 2023, and we are in the inventory stage right now with an environmental scan survey posted at www.na.org/survey for delegates to fill out before December. The results of that survey will be discussed at the zonal level, and those discussions will help shape the strategic plan objectives and milestones. The inventory process will be the focus of the September conference participant web meeting.

IDTS POSTED

We have posted English and Spanish workshop material and online input forms for two of this cycle's Issue Discussion Topics (IDTs): Gender-Neutral and Inclusive Language in NA Literature and Dealing with Disruptive and Predatory Behavior: www.na.org/idt. H&I SURVEY

We are collecting ideas to revise *H&l Basics* to reflect current practices and cover the specifics of *H&l service* in more depth. Our current vision is to have three *H&l Basics*—one focused on corrections, drug courts, and sponsorship behind the walls; another focused on carrying the message into treatment facilities; and one more on *H&l* committees and their function. The survey is posted in Spanish and English with Farsi, French, German, Hebrew, and Portuguese coming soon: www.na.org/survey.

FUTURE OF THE WSC

The workgroup for the Future of the WSC will meet for the first time this month. The workgroup is large, with a member chosen by each zone, plus Iran, as well as three board members. The workgroup is charged with framing ideas, for World Board and conference participant discussion, about how to make a three-year conference cycle more valuable and productive. The topics they will address include the new planning process, how to add value to the interim WSC meeting, vetting *CAR* motions and the *CAR* survey, improving the inperson/hybrid WSC meeting, and more.

FOCUS GROUP VOLUNTEER FORM

World Services is starting to travel again on a very limited basis, in response to requests. In August, we traveled to the Canadian Assembly and Convention (CANA/ACNA) and the European Delegates Meeting (EDM). In October, we will host and attend the Afri-Can Zonal Forum (AZF) and attend the Multi-Zonal Service Symposium (MZSS)), and we will attend the Latin American Zonal Forum (LAZF) in October/November. We are still trying to participate virtually when possible to better steward our scarce resources.
