Additionally, a pre-populated written ballot will expedite the rounds of vote counting for each position in which the person has to leave and come back into the room. This meeting was our largest at 60 plus attendees with many newcomers. If some of them feel we are under surveillance, they may not come. And addicts may die. How can we express the gravity of the situation to parole. Can we prohibit them? Anyways... our PR HI meets next Sunday and I would like some suggestions to take to our committee. Thanks for any help.




