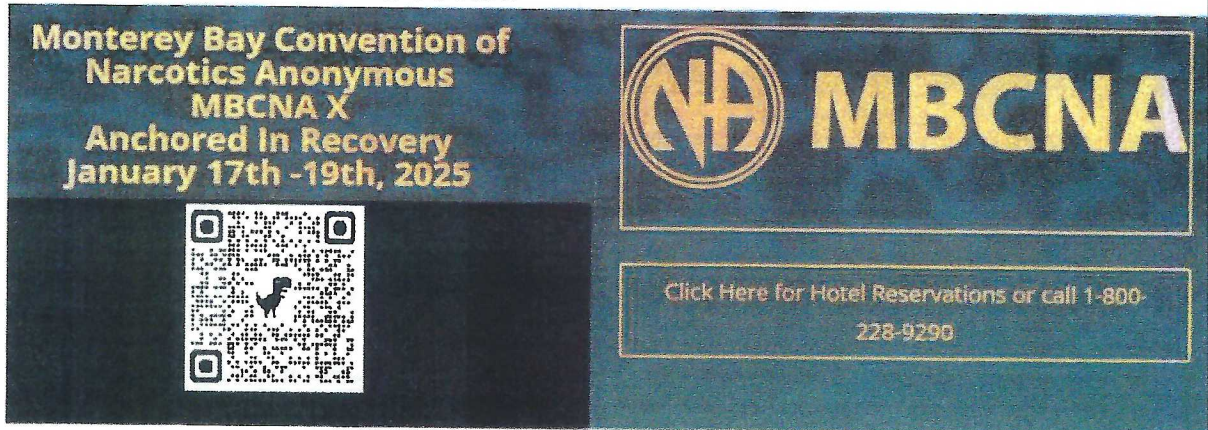

2024-0815 RCM SCFNA REPORT TO ASC

PR:

Regional PR wants to attend National Association of Social Workers-California Chapter Conference in Oakland on November 8, 2024.

RCC (Regional Communication): Lost minutes from last month. Will now lock minutes in future so only RCC and Chair can delete so this does not happen again.

NCCNA:

Closing Report from NCCNA45: \$47,663.96 (profit) contributed to RSC. Received credit from A/V vendor of ~7K for the poor-quality audio. Rebates from conv center/hotels = \$13,630; Merchandise profit = \$20,860.15. 3751 Paid Registrations; 124 registrations given out.

Forum Topics:

Tech Help: RCC created contact list of people who need tech help and who can help.

Areas with 501C3 & Raffles: Do other Areas have clauses regarding no gambling at NA events. State regulations are very strict to allow Raffles (lots of work – is doable but really not worth it). Its not worth the risk, its problematic, just don't do it. The language on the Regional Boards website might need to be clearer so that future Areas don't wander into the complications of trying to do a raffle.

Newcomer Workshops/feedback: Do other Areas do newcomer workshops? What should be presented at a Newcomer workshop? Sac, Greater San Jose, Contra Costa County (<https://www.contracostana.org/new-to-na>) all have done Newcomer workshops on meeting etiquette, about NA, etc. Some meetings split-up and have newcomers ask questions or include an ask-it-basket. Region will have a folder on the Drive that Areas can add links and other resources on this topic.

RSC Budget Timing: How can we get more time to approve the RSC budget? Can we get draft budget done sooner. Can we utilize technology to help expedite budget review.

Regional supporting local events flyers: It is helpful to have Events supported by Regional Committees state on the flyer that it's a Regional Supported event. (i.e., the Lake County History Event in which the Regional History and Archives will be presenting)

Predatory Behavior: World is looking into drafts for Predatory and Disruptive Behavior. Look on NA.org <https://na.org/service-material/locally-developed-service-material/>

Board Member passes away: H&A interviewed a member who recently passed away. He left a message for RSC and discussion about how we handle that with regards to the member's family. What kind of precedent would this set if we needed family approval to listen [to consented interviews] after member passes. A non-interview message is a digital asset that should be approved by family before being replayed.

Retracted BOD Member Qualification: Member no longer wants to be in the pool. How is that handled? Take them out of the pool. The member resigned, remove them from the pool. The person is in a pool and not in a legal position, since she's not on the board no big deal. **Have open pool seat for BOD.**

Insurance Changes: Waivers are only connected to a policy that has been issued by an insurer of a Northern California Region. Board voted to pull the waiver form off of the last page of the special insurance page on website because it has been greatly misunderstood and misused. In the future when you apply for, and are issued insurance under the NA policy, then you will get a waiver form. The Waiver is a secondary way to acknowledge that they are not covered. The waiver is limited to indicate that you are insured for some stuff (like meetings) but not for other stuff in the event. If we have a current event policy through NA's insurance (Philadelphia insurance) then they can get the waiver from Region Office, if they don't already have it as part of the packet they completed.

Motions:

Create a private Facebook page for the region which is monitored by the RRC w/most restrictive option & allows FST to have admin access - PASSED

The budget will be sent to the areas for approval 90 days or 3 RSCs prior to the date needed for approval at the RSC. This timeline will allow areas time to gather group/area votes on the RSCs next fiscal year's annual budget.

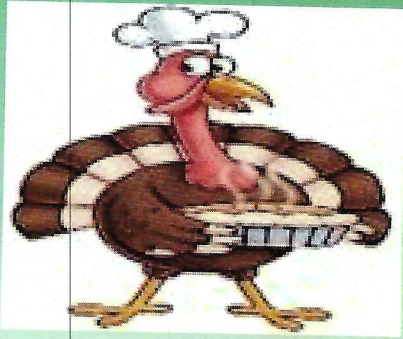
