7. A simple majority of votes cast, excluding abstentions, will decide all regular business matters and elections, unless otherwise indicated by Parliamentary Procedures.

8. A two-thirds (¾) majority of votes cast, excluding abstentions, shall decide policy matters, budgets, and Guideline changes after having been tabled until the next regular ASC meeting, Tabling is so that GSRs can take back to Groups to discuss and vote.

Maker: Kelly C. Second: Stephanie M.

Intent: The intent of this motion is to align our voting process with Robert's Rules of Order and eliminate confusion in our guidelines. We have been calculating majorities (51%) or two-thirds (67%) based on all members present, including those who abstain, which can block votes and does not follow Robert's Rules as referenced in our guidelines. This clarification specifies that votes should be calculated based only on the votes cast, excluding abstentions. This ensures abstentions do not affect the outcome and prevents future misunderstandings about their impact to the final vote.
