





- Who pays for the Live Scan?
- CDCR covers the cost.
- Which fire camps are open / closest to Sonoma County?
- Check the CDCR website under "Fire Camps" for the most current list.
- Does having more local people cleared help open camps to meetings?
- No, all camps want meetings regardless of how many people are cleared.
- Is clearance transferable between facilities (e.g., jail/prison to fire camp)?
- No, fire camp clearance must be done separately through CDCR.
- How long is clearance valid?
- One year. Volunteers must also complete annual TB testing and online training to remain cleared.
